Antibiotic Drops	Ocuflox Ofloxacin Polytrim Polymyxin	Use 1 drop in the surgical eye(s) the night before, and the morning of the procedure.Continue 1 drop in the surgical eye(s) 4x per day for 7 days.
Anti-Inflammatory Drops Shake Well Before Using	Pred-Forte 1% Prednisolone acetate	Use 1 drop in the surgical eye(s) every hour while awake on day zero. (surgery day) Continue 1 drop in the surgical eye(s) 4x per day for 7 days.
Lubrication Drops	Systane or Refresh brands	Use 1 drop every 2 hours while awake x 1 week. Then 1 drop 4x per day or as needed.

ACTIVITIES:

No showering for 24 hours after procedure. Wait one full week before swimming, wearing eye makeup, exercising or other strenuous activities. Avoid dusty/dirty environments. No driving until permitted.

VISUAL RECOVERY:

- Your vision will slowly improve over a period of 5 to 10 days.
- You can wear makeup and return to your normal activities 1 week after your procedure.
- Your focus will vary throughout the day and it will take several seconds for objects to become clear. Your depth perception may be lacking for 7-10 days, so take special care, especially when driving.
- Your progress will be monitored at regularly scheduled visits and management will be decided accordingly.

STANDARD EXAM SCHEDULE:

- You will have a follow up appointment on the day after your procedure and again after 3-7 days to check for infection and inflammation.
- You will be scheduled for a 1 month, 3 month, 6 month and 12 month follow up appointment to check for normal healing.
- You will need to schedule annual eye exams with your eye doctor to check for visual stability, evaluate general eye health and to maintain your TLC Lifetime Commitment.
